

SOUTH END BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS BRIDGES PROJECT CONSTRUCTION CLOSURES AND DETOURS PLAN

Construction of the South Wenatchee Bike and Pedestrian Access Bridges is coming up soon, and the City of Wenatchee has released a map with bike and pedestrian detour information.

**PROJECT CONSTRUCTION WILL BEGIN
IN EARLY APRIL 2025**

IF YOU WALK OR BIKE THE CLARK PIPELINE BRIDGE...

We'll keep the path on the bridge open on at least one side as long as it is safe. If you can't get to the side that's open, or if both sides are closed, please follow the detour or consider taking the Link Transit Bus, which has a bike rack. Route information can be found at the QR Code below.

WHAT TO EXPECT...

- Crews will be building bicycle/pedestrian access bridges at both ends of the Clark Pipeline Bridge, requiring a temporary detour and closures of the bridge.
- Work begins on the east side, starting with excavation for the new piers that will support the upcoming ramp structures and bridge over SR 28.
- Beginning June 4th, the Loop Trail will be closed at the east and west access points and across the Clark Pipeline Bridge for 17 months and anticipated to reopen in November of 2026.
- Hale Dog Park will also be impacted intermittently during the construction window.

SOUTH END BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS BRIDGES PROJECT CONSTRUCTION

Project construction will begin in early April 2025 with site mobilization in East Wenatchee and demolition of the existing bridge ramp into Hale Park in Wenatchee. Beginning June 4th, the Loop Trail will be closed at these access points and across the Clark Pipeline Bridge for 17 months and anticipated to reopen in November of 2026
