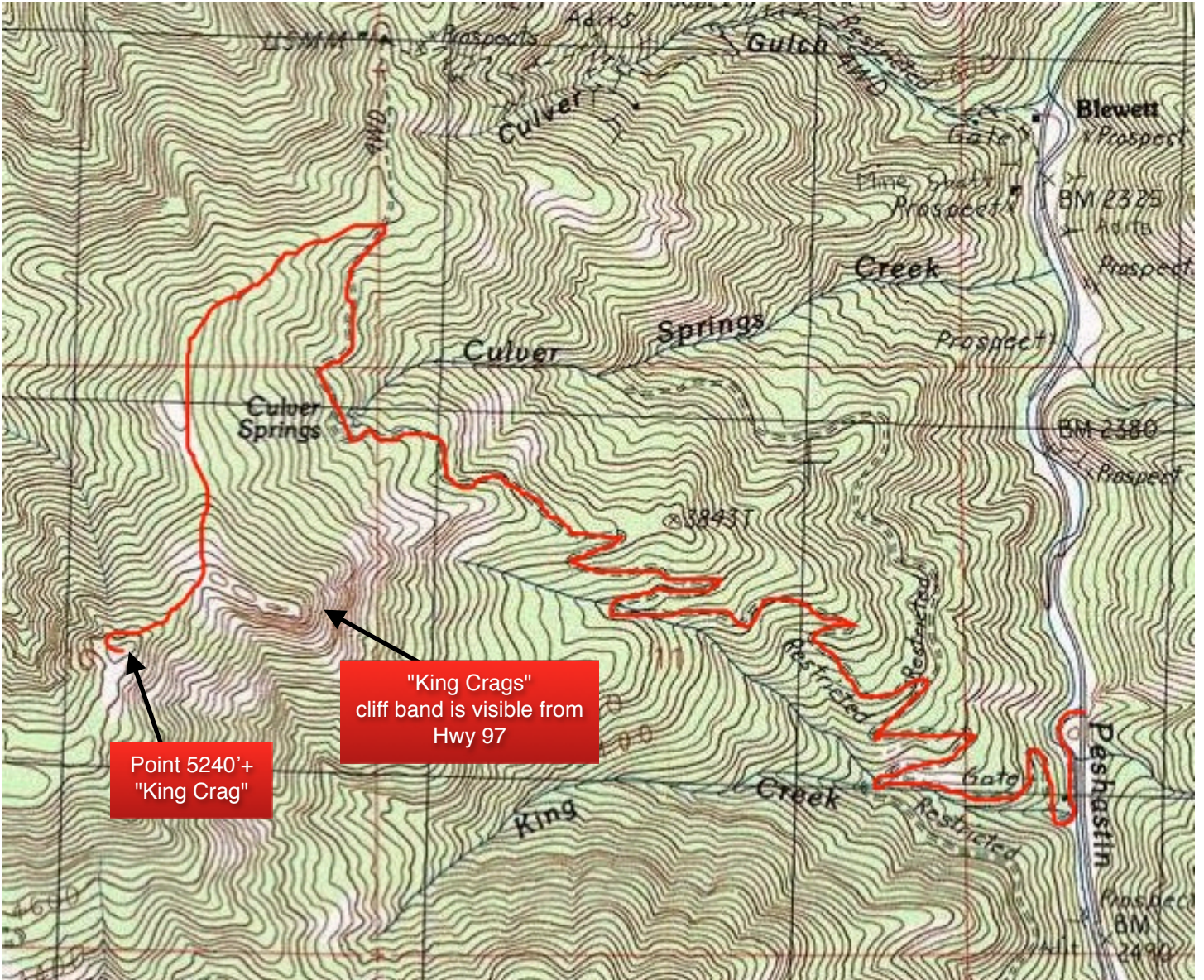


"King Crag" (Point 5240'+)



9.4 miles roundtrip; ~2760' elevation gain. Park by a gated spur (FS 7316) alongside Highway 97, about one mile south of the Blewett interpretive sign. There is room for about three cars, don't block the gate. 3/4 of the distance is road walking. 1/4 of the distance is cross country hiking that is mostly open timber and seldom brushy.

"King Crag" are visible from Highway 97 while driving either north or south. Point 5240'+ ("King Crag") is not visible from the highway, hidden by the slightly lower "King Crag."

FS 7316 road is in good shape for walking. Above Culver Springs follow a ridge that includes an old cat track, some cut logs, and occasional tread. The slightly lower "King Crag" that are visible from Highway 97 have some scrambling routes to ridge top viewpoints.

The higher "King Crag" (USGS Point 5240'+) is 1/4 mile to the southwest of the slightly lower "King Crag." CalTopo software measures the top at 5243'. It has a class 2 scramble route, finishing on the northwest side. The Enchantments highlight the summit views.
